All participants are invited to submit an abstract for workshops, symposia, oral and/or poster presentations. It is not necessary to be a member of a member national society of the International Society of Behavioral Medicine to submit an abstract. Abstracts will be blindly reviewed by members of the Scientific Program Committee. All accepted abstracts will be published in a program book, and a special issue of the International Journal of Behavioral Medicine.

Submission Instructions

Abstracts for the 11th International Congress of Behavioral Medicine need to be submitted according to the instructions that appear in this Call for Abstracts. ONLY those abstracts submitted via the official ICBM abstract submission site will be considered. Special Instructions for Workshop Presenters

The main presenter of the workshop will have his or her conference membership fee reimbursed provided 10 or more participants register for the workshop.

If 6 to 9 participants register, one presenter will receive half of this fee waived.

When fewer than 6 participants register, the workshop will be offered only if the main workshop presenter agrees to conduct the workshop without compensation, otherwise the workshop will be cancelled.

The International Society of Behavioral Medicine (ISBM) is a federation of national societies, whose goal is to serve the needs of all health-related disciplines concerned with issues relevant to behavioral medicine.
